The cemetery commission did not do an in depth search, those wishing further information may find it through their own search. Information below is a best guess, further research is needed:.

Be advised that privacy issues will enter your search for family information. The more recent the data you seek, the more likely it will be protected. World War II information is getting easier to obtain, you still are likely to encounter privacy issues, data older than that era may have little to no restrictions, more recent data certainly will. Information entered within square brackets, “[]” is information added by data compiler.

Should family members and their descendants wish to contribute information about their veterans, they may do so via the Town Clerk's webpage. The cemetery commission reserves the right to not publish the information subject to their review of the contents.

REVOLUTIONARY WAR

Beckley, Zebedee (Section South, Row ?) [1764] - d. Feb 5, 1851]

Continental, CT; born at Weathersfield, CT 1763; residence Goshen, CT; Captain Savage's company 1777; married at Berlin, CT 1789; died Barre 1851; married Elizabeth; (Soldiers, Sailors, and Patriots of the Revolutionary War Vermont by Fisher) Grave also listed by the DAR.

The Beckley family brought a rich military history to Barre. The family history stated Zebedee served while in his early teens after the death of his father, Zebedee, Sr., on 4 December 1776 while serving in the Army. In Wethersfield, CT, Oct 1777, Zebedee, Jr. enlisted in Captain Savage's Company, Colonel Sherburne's Continental Regiment, and served as a private for seven months. At Goshen, CT, August 1778, served two months in Captain Ensign's Company, Colonel Moses' Connecticut Regiment. In August 1781, served three months in Captain Griffin's Company, Colonel Jackson's Connecticut Regiment. Zebedee also served in the War of 1812, see his entry in the section below. He received a pension beginning on August 7, 1832 while a resident of Barre, VT, he passed away in Barre on February 5, 1851. Also, see the entries for son Horace and grandson George. (Source: The Descendants of Richard Beckley of Wethersfield, Connecticut, by Caroleen Beckley Sheppard, 1948)

Dix, Benjamin [1757] - d. Jun 19, 1827]

Connecticut, born circa 1757; enlisted Wethersfield, CT; Captain Wyll's company, 1777; residence Barre 1818; died at Montpelier 1827; m. Anna; 1(S39446); CL-5a, 49:235. (Soldiers, Sailors, and Patriots of the Revolutionary War Vermont by Fisher) Benjamin can be found listed in the 1818 Pension Roll for Washington County, Vermont. Unfortunately, the reference found in the "Abstracts of Graves of Revolutionary Patriots," lists the cemetery where Dix can be found as "Maple Grove" near the east town line, Barre, VT.

Dodge, Nathanael B. (Section South) [[1740] - d. Aug 20, 1823]

Massachusetts, also New Hampshire; born Dudley, MA 1740; Captain Capron's NH company 1778; died Barre 1823; married (1) Lydia; (2) Hannah; (3) Tabitha; (Soldiers, Sailors, and Patriots of the Revolutionary War Vermont by Fisher) [3-213] A muster roll of Captain Oliver Capron's company in Colonel Samuel Ashley's regiment of militia which marched to the relief of Ticonderoga, Private Nath'l Brown Dodge, time of engagement on 29 June, discharged July 11, served 13 days. (New Hampshire State Papers, Volume 15, page 55.) Grave listed by the DAR.

Dodge, Thomas (Section South) [[1759] - d. Aug 11, 1827]

Massachusetts; born Sutton, MA 1759; enlisted Dudley, MA; Captain Carriel's company 1776; married at Middlesex 1807; died Barre 1827; married Abigail, names Sally in pension files.; (Soldiers, Sailors, and Patriots of the Revolutionary War Vermont by Fisher) (Listed in the NSDAR Index)

Thomas served in Captain Jonathan Carriel's company, Colonel Josiah Whitney's regiment; a company receipt showed an advance pay for 1 month, etc., dated Point Shirley, Jun 13, 1776; also, as a Private in the same company and regiment, service from May 30, 1776, 4 days preceding march, to Aug 1, 1776, 2 months 2 days; also as a Private, Captain Nathaniel Healy's company, Colonel Jonathan Holman's regiment; service 25 days; marched to Rhode Island on an alarm in December 1776; served in the company stationed at Providence Jan 21, 1777; also in Captain Reuben Sibley's company Colonel Josiah Whitney's regiment; marched July 31, 1778; discharged Sep 13 1778, service 1 month 15 days, at Rhode Island. (Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors of the Revolutionary War)

Glidden, Joseph (Section South) [[1751] - d. Oct 13, 1836]
Massachusetts; born 1751; residence Beverly, MA; Captain Munro's company 1777; died 1836, buried Barre; (Soldiers, Sailors, and Patriots of the Revolutionary War Vermont by Fisher)

Joseph has been listed as a carpenter aboard the ship "Pilgrim" commanded by Captain Joseph Robinson; in a descriptive list of officers and crew dated Aug 2, 1780. Joseph has been described as aged 50 years; stature, 5 ft 8 in., with a dark complexion; his residence listed as Beverly. Judging from the physical description, this Joseph would be too old to be born in 1751, his father, perhaps. (Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors of the Revolutionary War) (Note: Joseph not found in NSDAR Index)

Goldsbury, William, Sr. [[1761] - May 12, 1815 at 54 yrs.] (Section South)
Vermont; born Brookfield, Massachusetts; 1762; resided in Clarendon; served in Captain Sawyer's company 1779; died in Barre 1815 and married to Bathsheba. (Soldiers, Sailors, and Patriots of the Revolutionary War Vermont by Fisher)

Howland, Eseck/Esek (Section West) [[1762] - d. Sep 15, 1841]
Massachusetts; born Middleboro, MA 1760; served in Captain Pearce's company in 1776; residence Plainfield, 1797; died East Montpelier, 1841; married Phebe; E-1, pp 31-32. (Soldiers, Sailors, and Patriots of the Revolutionary War Vermont by Fisher)

Esek served as a Private in Captain Job Peirce's (Middleborough) company, Colonel Sprowatt's (Sprout's) regiment; marched on Dec 9, 1776, service for 10 days, company marched to Tiverton, R.I. on an alarm at Howland's Ferry. (Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors of the Revolutionary War) (Not in the NSDAR Index, military service does not appear in the family history, but not necessary to show there.)

WAR OF 1812

Beckley, Horace (Section South) [[1792 - d. Sep 15, 1877]

Barre. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh, September 1814, and served 9 days in Captain Warren Ellis' company. Also served in Captain March's company and Captain Stacey's company. Pension Certificate No. 19574. Pension Certificate of widow, Hannah, No. 13197. (Adjutant General's Roster, 1812-14)

Son of Zebedee, below, service mentioned in family history *The Descendants of Richard Beckley of Wethersfield, Connecticut*, by Caroleen Beckley Sheppard, 1948.

Beckley, Zebedee (Section South) [[1764] - d. Feb 5, 1851]

Barre; volunteered to go to Plattsburgh, September 1814, and served 8 days as a teamster in Captain Warren Ellis' company. Ref: Book 52, AGO, pages 219 and 242. (Adjutant General's Roster, 1812-14)

Service mentioned in family history *The Descendants of Richard Beckley of Wethersfield, Connecticut*, by Caroleen Beckley Sheppard, 1948.

Service in Continental Army and State Regiments, pension W 15579 (widow's); Elizabeth's pension BLW 26807-160-55 (Bounty Land Warrant)

Dodge, Asa, 1812 (Section 2) [Feb 13, 1770 - May 12, 1855]

Served from Apr 12, 1814 to Apr 21, 1814 in Captain Shubael Wale's company, Colonel W.B. Sumner's regiment. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh, Sep 1814, and served 10 days in Captain Warren Ellis's company. (Adjutant General's Roster, 1812-14)

Dodge, John (Section South) [[1767] - died Apr 17, 1835 at 68y]

From Dodge Family.org: John Dodge of Barre, Vermont; Army, served 12 April – 21 April 1814 in Captain Shubael Whales Company, Colonel W. B. Sumner's Regiment; he died 17 April 1835, John's parents were Nathaniel Brown Dodge and Lydia Barber. Submitted by Whitney Maxfield.

Farwell, Lemuel [FFV ref.] (Section 2) [broken gravestone, no dates]

Individual 1233, born 1775 in Barre, VT, married in March 1798 to Patience Walker, daughter of Colonel Benjamin Walker of Barre. Lemuel died in Barre on April 10, 1848. "Colonel in Vermont Militia, probably." (*The Farwell Family*, Vol. 1, by Abbott and Wilson, 1929) Abby Hemingway's *Gazetteer* lists Lemuel Farwell as a colonel.

Glidden, Joseph Jr., 1812 (Section South) [[1783] - d. Jan 23, 1866]

Barre, Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh, Sep 1814, and served 9 days in Captain Warren Ellis's company. (Adjutant General's Roster, 1812-14)

Goldsbury, William Jr. (Section South) [[1793] - d. Sep 10, 1818]
Barre. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh, September 1814, and served in Captain Warren Ellis' company. Ref: Hemingway's Vt. Gazetteer, Vol. 4, page 41.

Howland, Eseck/Esek (Section West) [[1790] - d. Jun 3, 1872]
On page 191, individual 394: born in Middleborough, married Laura Holden. When the British raided from Canada, Esek and some friends stole a cannon and hauled it to Burlington during the Battle of Plattsburgh, but the group did not make it in time to join in the fight. (History of Arthur, Henry, and John Howland and their descendants, by Franklyn Howland, 1883.)

Lawson, Samuel, (Section South) [1777 - d. Jun 20, 1834]
Barre, Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh, Sep 1814, and served 10 days in Captain Warren Ellis's company. (Adjutant General's Roster, 1812-14)

Rodee, Peter (Section South) [Dec 3, 1794 - Jun 21, 1873]
In Family Sketches of Franklin County, Vermont – Fairfield, the sketch for Rodee, Charles M., the author listed the name of Charles' father as D. L. Rodee, born 1828, Peru, NY, the son of Peter and Sarah Lobdell Rodee. D. L. came from Dutchess County, NY, served as a soldier in the War of 1812, and fought at the Battle of Plattsburgh.

CIVIL WAR:

Vermont in the Civil War website: buried at Maplewood: Bassett, Calvin; Beckley, George; Carleton, Newell; Dow, Jerome L.; Howland, Arthur L.; Howland, Hiram B.; Richards, Linus; Howard, Charles;

Bassett, Calvin (Section Center) [1845 – 1911]
According to the Vermont Civil War website, Calvin enlisted on November 12, 1861 at the age of 17. He mustered in a week later on the 19th with the 1st Vermont Calvary, his service credited to Barre, Vermont. As a minor, his parents had the right to have him released from the army, apparently they did. He enlisted a second time on September 15, 1862 and mustered into Company D of the 15th Vermont Volunteers as a private. Calvin mustered out on the 5th of August, 1863. The website gave his birth as October 19, 1845 and death on April 7, 1911.

Beckley, George I. (Section South) [1837 – 1920]
Credited to Barre, VT, 8th Vermont Infantry, US Veterans Reserve Corps. Enlisted in Company A as a band player on December 3, 1863, mustering in on the 15th of December. He traveled to New Orleans with General Thomas where he took ill. George transferred into the Veterans Corps in July of 1864 and mustered out July 24, 1865. (<http://vermontcivilwar.org>) A son of Horace

Beckley, War of 1812, and grandson of Zebedee Beckley, Revolutionary War and War of 1812, also buried at Maplewood. (George's service mentioned in family history The Descendants of Richard Beckley of Wethersfield, Connecticut, by Caroleen Beckley Sheppard, 1948.)

Carleton, Newell (Section South, Row ?) [1842] – Nov 16, 1861]

Mr. Carleton's gravestone shows he died at Camp Griffin, VA, and served as a Corporal in Company B, 4th Vermont Volunteers. Credited to Williamstown, VT, Newell enlisted on August 20, 1861 and mustered in a month later. He served as a corporal in Company B of the 4th Vermont Infantry and died of typhoid fever on the 16th of November of the same year. (<http://vermontcivilwar.org>)

[Note: Camp Griffin near present day McLean, Virginia provided the winter quarters for Vermont's 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th regiments, many among the 70,000 troops stationed there for the season.]

Dow, Jerome L. (Section South) [d. Aug 24, 1861]

Age 18, credited to Hinesburg, VT. Service: 1st New Hampshire Infantry. Born: unknown; residence Hinesburg, VT; died 08/24/1861. (<http://vermontcivilwar.org>)
1st Regiment NH Infantry, Company E: born Hinesburgh, VT, age 18, resided Nashua, NH, enlisted April 22, 1861, mustered in May 2, 1861 as a private, mustered out August 9, 1861. Died August 24, 1861 at Nashua. (Register of New Hampshire Soldiers and Sailors in the War of the Rebellion)

Howard, Charles H. (Section 2) [[1846] - d. Oct 13, 1866]

Another young man to enlist from Barre at age 17, Charles joined up on August 25, 1862 and mustered into Company I of the 13th Vermont Infantry. While serving as a private, he received wounds at Gettysburg on the 3rd of July 1863 and mustered out on the 21st of the same month. Charles passed away in 1866 while in New York. (<http://vermontcivilwar.org>)

Howland, Arthur L. (Section South) [Jan 18, 1846 - Sep 10, 1917]

Age 18, credited to East Montpelier, VT. Service: enlisted 9/21/63, mustered in 3/3/64, Private, Company E, 17th Vermont Infantry; wounded, Spotsylvania, 5/12/64, wounded, 6/22/64, deserted, 11/4/64. Born: about 1845, unknown; died unknown; died/buried in: Barre, VT. – from the Vermont Civil War website.

Howland, Hiram B., (Section South) [[1819] - d. Nov 13, 1883]

Company G, 6th Vermont Volunteers. Age 42, credited to East Montpelier, VT. Service: enlisted 10/15/61, mustered in 10/15/61, Private, Company G, 6th VT Infantry, mustered out 1/21/63 (listed as Holland in roster, Howland in pension index card and tombstone) Born: 06/14/1819, Unknown; died 11/13/1883 – from the Vermont Civil War website.

Morehouse, D.[aniel] W. (Section West) [1826 – 1903]

Some sites claim he is buried in Underhill Flats Cemetery, Underhill, Vt.

Morehouse, Daniel W., age 35, credited to Milton, VT. Service: enlisted 9/19/61, mustered in Company A, 1st Vermont Cavalry, 11/19/61, Prisoner of War 5/24/62 Paroled 9/13/62, transferred to Veterans Reserve Corps, 3/25/64, mustered out 11/19/64. Born: 1826, Unknown; died 01/19/1903 – from the Vermont Civil War website. [More likely to be in Maplewood instead of Underhill as his wife can be found in the same plot in Maplewood.]

Richards, Linus (Section West) [d. 1 May 1863]

Died at Wolf Run Shoals, age 25, credited to Plainfield, VT. Service: enlisted 8/22/62, mustered in 10/4/62, Private, Company D, 12th Vermont Infantry, died/discharged 5/2/63, born: 1837, Unknown; died 05/02/1863 – from the Vermont Civil War website.

Barber, Charles Newell, 1st World War [1884 – 1958] (Section South 1)

32 6/12 years. Residence: Northfield, born: Barre. Entered federal service: Apr 2, 1917. Organizations: 1st Vt. Infantry. (57th Pioneer Division) to discharge. Principal station: Camp Wadsworth, France. Grades: Captain (Regimental Adjutant) Apr 2, 1917. Overseas: Sep 28, 1918 to Mar 20, 1919. Discharged Jun 2, 1919. (Adjutant General's Roster, WWI)

Barber, Justin Morrill [1898 – 1971] (Section West)

4, 035, 18 years. Residence: Barre, born at Barre. Enlisted Dec 26, 1916 at Barre. Entered federal service Apr 2, 1917. Organizations: Headquarters. Company, 1st Vermont Infantry to Jun 30, 1917; Medical Detachment, 1st Vermont Infantry to ____, Medical Department, 103d Infantry to Feb 8, 1918; Ambulance Section 101st Sanitary Train to Mary 10, 1918; Medical Detachment 101st Infantry to discharge. Grades: 1/c Private, Aug 1, 1917. Overseas: Sep 27, 1917 to Apr 5, 1919. Discharged Apr 28, 1919 at Camp Devens.

Edward, Alfred George, [1891 – 1955] (Section South)

24 years. Residence: Barre. Born at Banchory, Scotland. Enlisted Mar 19, 1914, Montpelier; Entered federal service Jul 25, 1917. Organization: Company H 1st Vermont Infantry to discharge. Grades: Corporal Aug 1, 1916; Private. Discharge Sep 16, 1917 at Camp Bartlett, Massachusetts by reason of dependent relatives. (Adjutant General's Roster, WWI)

Grout, Max L., PRIVATE US Army (Center) [Feb 28, 1901 – Sep 20, 1976]

383106 18 2/12 years. Residence: Waterbury, born at Waterbury. Enlisted: May 25, 1918, Fort Slocum, NY. Organizations: 2nd RCT (Recruit) Company, GSI, (General Service Infantry) Fort Slocum, NY; Headquarters, Training 303rd Cavalry to Aug 14, 1918; Headquarters Company 53d Field Artillery to discharge. Discharge: Jan 31, 1919, (Adjutant General's Roster, WWI)

Kirton, Alexander T. J. (Section South) [1892 – 1947]

2,462,448, 26 years. Residence: Barre, born at Aberdeen, Scotland. Inducted May 16, 1918 at Burlington. Organizations: Training Detachment, University of Vermont, Burlington, to discharge. Grades: Mechanic, Nov 4, 1918. Discharge: Dec 5, 1918 at Burlington.

LePage, Clarence Josiah, (Section South) [1881 – 1968]

35 11/12 years. Residence: Barre, born: Barre. Entered federal service Apr 3, 1917. Organization 1st Vt. Infantry. (57th Pioneer Division); School of Military Aero. Principal station: Fort. Ethan Allen; Camp Bartlett, Mass; Camp Greene, N.C.; Camp Wadsworth, S.C.; Kelly Field, Texas, Austin, TX. Grades: 1st Lt. Infantry. Apr 3, 1917, discharge Apr 28, 1919. (Adjutant General's Roster, WWI)

Mason, Gerald Joe, (Section South) [1896 – 1976]

67483 20 11/12 years. Residence: Barre, official record E. Montpelier. Born at Barre. Enlisted: Jun 5, 1917, Fort. Ethan Allen. Organizations: Company C, 1st Vt. Infantry. (Company C 103rd Infantry) to discharge. Overseas: Sep 26, 1917 to Dec 30, 1918. Slightly wounded in action: Oct 31, 1918. Discharge: Jan 8, 1919, Camp Devens. (Adjutant General's Roster, WWI)

Meaker, Beckley Ray (?)(Section Center) [1896 – 1950]

1231509 21 6/12 years. Residence: Barre, VT, born at Barre. Enlisted: Dec 14, 1917, Fort Slocum, NY. Organizations: Company H 1st VT Infantry (Company H 57th Pioneer Infantry) to Jul 4, 1918; Company A 5th Anti Aircraft Machine Gun Battalion to discharge. Overseas Sep 30, 1918 to Jan 16, 1919. Discharge Feb 5, 1919, Camp Devens. (Adjutant General's Roster, WWI)

Phillips, Clair A., Sr. (Section West) [1896 – 1968]

2722903 22 2/12 years. Residence: Burlington, born Waterbury. Inducted May 24, 1918 in Montpelier. Company G, 302nd Infantry to Dec 12 1918; 241st Company Military Police Corps to Jan 1, 1919; Company B 2nd General Headquarters Military Police Battalion to discharge. Grades: 1/c Private, Dec 2, 1918. Overseas Jul 5, 1918 to Jul 20, 1919. Discharge Jul 25, 1919. (Adjutant General's Roster, WWI)

D'Amico, Joseph J. (Section North) [1922-2003]

No further details, not in the Vermont roster nor service mentioned in his obituary as printed in the Times Argus. According to his death certificate, Joseph was born in Buffalo, NY, he married Lorraine Laferriere, and lived in St. Albans.

Foreign Service: Eastern Atlantic and Mediterranean Theater. Comments: Wounded in Action European Theater of Operations 13 Dec 44, 07 Jan 45. (Adjutant General's Roster, WWII)

Fuller, Clifford B., PFC, US Army (Section South) [1915 – 2001]
